The City Council

The City Council consists of seven members, elected by the voters of the City to staggered terms of four years each. The City Council is the only representative body elected directly by the voters of Redwood City. The Council appoints from its own members the Mayor and Vice Mayor, and each serve two consecutive years in those roles.

As the legislative branch of the government, it makes final decisions on all major city matters. The Council adopts ordinances and resolutions necessary for efficient governmental operations, approves the budget, and acts as a board of appeals.

The Council appoints the City Manager, City Attorney, City Clerk, as well as the members of the City's boards, committees, and commissions. The City Council also serves as the Redevelopment Agency and the Board of Equalization.

City Council Meetings

The City Council typically meets two times per month, on the second and the fourth Mondays at 7:00 p.m. The Council may also meet on the first Monday of the month, if the need arises.
