

Single-Family Resident Limits

- ❑ Two (2) cubic yards per household (equivalent to twelve 32-gallon cans or a 3 x 3 x 6 foot bundled or containerized pile).
- ❑ Plus one appliance or other large item; refrigerators require special handling and must be requested at the same time you schedule your clean-up date. **Refrigerator doors must be removed.**

Multi-Family Resident Limits

- ❑ One (1) cubic yard per unit (equivalent to six 32 gallon cans or a 3 x 3 x 3 foot bundled or containerized pile).
- ❑ Plus one appliance or other large item; refrigerators require handling and must be requested at the same time you schedule your clean-up date. **Refrigerator doors must be removed.**

NO SINGLE ITEM CAN BE MORE THAN 200 POUNDS.

CUSTOMERS ARE SUBJECT TO ADDITIONAL CHARGES FOR EXCEEDING THE LIMITS.

It is illegal to dump in or around a garbage container that is not intended for your use.

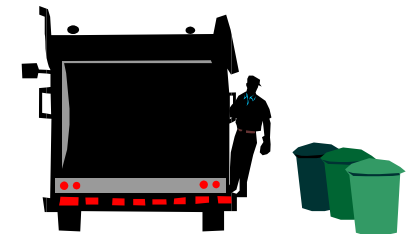
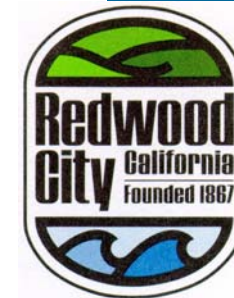

Placement of BFI Garbage Recyclable and Yard Waste Containers

The City of Redwood City is always concerned about making our town a better place to live. The Code Enforcement Team has been receiving an increasing number of complaints regarding the placement of BFI garbage, recyclable, and yard waste containers. The early set out of BFI garbage,

recyclable, and yard waste containers not only creates a visual blight in a neighborhood, but if knocked over, may block storm drains or create a hazard to pedestrians and

vehicles. The early placement can also attract health nuisances such as flies and rodents. City codes prohibit the placement of BFI garbage, recyclable, and yard waste containers at the curb before twelve o'clock (12:00) **noon on the day prior** to the scheduled collection day, and require that the same containers be put back by twelve o'clock (12:00) **noon on the day following** the scheduled collection.



FURTHER RESTRICTIONS REQUIRE:

- **All BFI garbage and yard waste containers must remain watertight. Lids must fit tightly and remain in place at all times.**
- **All BFI garbage, recyclable, and yard waste containers must not be visible from any public street, sidewalk, or place after the collection date has passed. Containers must be stored in the rear yard out of public view.**

Continued violations of the above mentioned Redwood City Codes may result in the issuance of an **Administrative Citation** to the resident or property owner. The **Administrative Citation** carries a fine of **\$50.00 for the first offense**. Fines can increase for continued violations.

On-Call Residential Clean-ups Replace Spring/Fall Clean-ups

On-call clean-up is designed to encourage more recycling and meet your needs and your schedule. This new service, available to residential customers **twice a year, replaces the spring and fall clean-ups provided by BFI.**

All appointments all take place on your regular recycling collection day, usually within two weeks after your request.

To schedule your on-call clean-up day, call BFI at (650) 592-2411 or sign-up on BFI's website at www.bfipeninsula.com

Clean-up materials must be placed **at the curb by 6:00 a.m.**

All trash must be bagged, boxed, bundled (4 feet or less) or containerized. Please keep yard waste and clean wood waste separate from clean-up materials as it can be recycled.

Acceptable materials include: trash, including all unwanted and unrecyclable material.

Prohibited materials include: motor vehicles, engines, transmissions, motorcycles, rock, dirt, broken concrete, paint, hot ashes, poison oak, animal waste, car batteries, commercial refrigerators, tires, dangerous liquids, or toxic substances requiring special disposal.

State law requires chlorofluorocarbon refrigerators (CFC's) be certifiably removed from "white goods" such as refrigerators, freezers, and air conditions before they can be recycled. For your on-call clean-up BFI will pickup customer "white goods" free of charge (except for apartment buildings) after you have the CFC's removed. (To help the route collection, **please call 592-2411 in advance** if you are going to have a refrigerator left at the curb. Doors must be removed and refrigerators must be empty.

Before throwing away that unwanted sofa, furniture, old clothing, etc., check with your local charitable organization to see if they can use your items. Let's re-use, if at all possible.

We understand that there may be an occasional circumstance that makes it difficult for you to comply with these time requirements.
