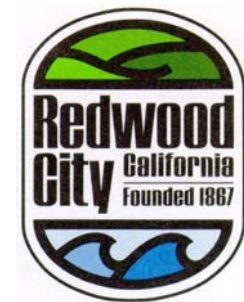

Overgrown Weeds & Vegetation Encroachment

Every spring, or after the rains have subsided, you may notice that weeds and overgrowth of various types appear in Redwood City. The overgrowth is commonly found in a residential yard, vacant lot, or encroaching upon a public right-of-way. At times the overgrowth is such that it becomes a breeding ground and harborage for rodents or insects. When summer arrives, much of the overgrowth dies and thus becomes a fire hazard.

What exactly is the City's policy or ordinances regarding overgrown weeds and vegetation encroachment?



WEEDS & OVERGROWTH

According to the Redwood City Code, it has been deemed a public nuisance for a property owner to allow the overgrowth of weeds, vegetation, dead, decayed, diseased, or hazardous trees that are likely to harbor rats, vermin, or constitute a fire hazard. (RCC 14.72F)



It is the property owner's duty and responsibility to have their vacant lots cleared of overgrown vegetation and their front or back lawns mowed before the grass reaches a height of 8". (RCC 14.38)

VEGETATION ENCROACHMENT

As trees and landscaping grows, it tends to encroach upon the public right-of-ways (sidewalks, streets, or alleys). This encroachment has also been deemed a public nuisance in the City Code and constitutes a hazard, which impedes the free movement of pedestrians or vehicles.

All vegetation, excluding trees, that grow in the parking strip (that portion of property between the street and sidewalk) must also be maintained by the property owner, and may not encroach upon the street/sidewalk or protrude any higher than 36 inches (3') above the level of the curb.

(RCC 14.72E)

Tree branches/foliage which overhangs a sidewalk must maintain a height no lower than 7 feet. Tree branches/foliage which overhangs a street or alley must maintain a height of no lower than 14 feet.

WARNING:

The cutting, removal, or pruning of any **PROTECTED TREE** (more than 38" in circumference or 12" in diameter) or any **CITY TREE** (commonly located in a park or parking strip) first requires a permit issued by the **Tree Section of**
