

### PARKING ON FRONT AND SIDE YARDS

It is prohibited to park or store any automobile, trailer, house trailer, camper, van, truck, pickup truck, recreational vehicle, boat, or other vehicle or other mobile equipment (whether or not motorized) upon the front yard (lawn) or street side yard of a corner lot. All operable vehicles located in the front of residences must be parked in legal garages, carports, or on the paved driveway or surface. (RCC 14.72 O)

### RESIDING IN VEHICLES

It is prohibited within the city limits of Redwood City for anyone to sleep in, cook in, or use for any other living purposes an automobile, trailer, house trailer, camper, van, truck, pickup truck, recreational vehicle, boat or other vehicle. (RCC 14.72 N)

### RESIDENTIAL VEHICLE REPAIR

The City of Redwood City authorizes citizens to perform minor routine maintenance repairs to their vehicles within a residential district.

Minor repairs such as changing the oil or the replacement of the air filter, spark plugs, brakes, tires, shocks, etc... is authorized in public view but not upon the public street.

Major vehicle repairs such as, but not limited to, replacing the engine/transmission, or major auto bodywork is only authorized if such work is being conducted inside a legal garage or carport.

While conducting vehicle repairs, it is the property owner's responsibility to ensure that any and all fluids, oils, etc... is not illicitly discharged into stormwater drain system.

# Parking Laws in Redwood City

## PARKING

It is prohibited to park or leave standing any vehicle upon a street or alley in a residential district for more than a consecutive period of 72 hours (3 days). In the event that a vehicle has been previously marked by a member of the Police Department, and the vehicle has not moved at least two tenths (0.20) of a mile within the aforesaid 72 hours, the vehicle may be removed from the public street by tow per the California Vehicle Code. (RCC 20.95)

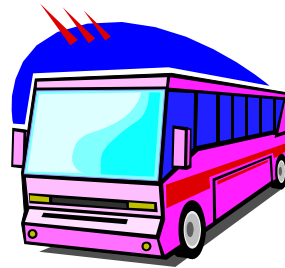
## ALL-NIGHT PARKING of CERTAIN VEHICLES (Commercial/RV/Trailers)

It is prohibited to park or leave standing any truck, bus, trailer, trailer coach, house car, camper or any commercial vehicle of any kind at any time on any street in the City for a period of time longer than one hour between the hours of 2 a.m. and 5 a.m.



It is also prohibited to park or leave standing any commercial vehicle having a manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating of 10,000 pounds or more at any time in a residential district unless it is reasonably necessary to unload property or perform a temporary service. (RCC 20.101 A, B)

*Nothing prohibits the parking and storage of recreational vehicles upon private property provided that the RV is operable and currently registered with The Department of Motor Vehicles.*



## CERTAIN PARKING PROHIBITED (For Sale/Repairs, Etc.)

It is prohibited in Redwood City to park a vehicle upon any roadway for the principal purpose of:

- A) Displaying such vehicle for sale.
- B) Washing, greasing or repairing such vehicle, except repairs necessitated by an emergency. It is permitted to wash a vehicle in a private driveway. (RCC 20.92 A, B)

## PARKING ACROSS SIDEWALKS

The parking of any vehicle at any time so as to obstruct the sidewalk is prohibited. Doing so inhibits the free movement of pedestrian traffic upon the sidewalk. (CVC 22500 f RCC 14.72 Q)

## BLOCKING DRIVEWAYS

The parking of vehicles in front of public or private driveways is prohibited in Redwood City. However, a property owner may park in front of his own driveway if he wishes to do so. (CVC 22500 e)

## INOPERATIVE VEHICLES

It is prohibited to park or store upon private property in Redwood City any inoperative automobile, trailer, house trailer, camper, van, truck, pickup truck, recreational vehicle, boat or other vehicle, or parts thereof unused and unattended for a period of one hundred twenty (120) consecutive hours (5 days) which is visible from any other private property or any public street, sidewalk or place. (RCC 14.72 M)

## INOPERATIVE DEFINED

An inoperative vehicle is defined as any vehicle that cannot be legally operated, moved or left standing upon any California street or highway because it is not currently registered or functioning. Vehicles that are not registered, even though they have been issued a Certificate of Nonoperation from the DMV are still considered inoperative in Redwood City and if visible are in violation of the ordinance.
