SYNOPSIS OF ALARM: Redwood City Firefighters along with the Menlo Park Fire Protection District responded to a report of a trailer fire. Upon firefighters arrival they found the trailer heavily involved in fire, with exposures on both sides of the trailer. Firefighters made an aggressive attack and confined the fire to the trailer of origin. They used their thermal imaging camera to check for hot spots.

The occupant of the trailer was pulled out by her son. She was checked by fire paramedics on scene and transported by ambulance to Stanford Hospital for observation.

It is unknown whether there was a working smoke detector in the residence at the time of the fire. Please remember that a properly working smoke detector gives you the best chance to exit a residence when it is full of smoke. In 2003 there were 3925 civilian fire deaths in the United States alone. This was an increase of 16.1% over the previous year. Over 80% or 3125 of these fire deaths occurred in the home. This reflects an increase of 17.8% over the previous year.

The cause is under investigation by the Fire Prevention Bureau.
