Subject

Amendment for support of the Redwood City Family Centers for FY 2005/2006

Recommendation

Approve and authorize the City Manager to execute the amendment between the County of San Mateo, the City of Redwood City, and the Redwood City School District for support of the Redwood City Family Centers for fiscal year 2005/2006.

Background

The City of Redwood City (City) in partnership with the Redwood City School District (District) and the County of San Mateo (County) agreed to assist the Redwood City Family Centers with sustainability of the program at Fair Oaks, Hoover, Kennedy and Taft schools. The Redwood City Family Centers were established to actively involve Redwood City residents, educators and human service providers in supporting neighborhood children to become successful learners. The Redwood City Family Centers provide one-stop services including health services, family support services, parent-community partnerships, adult education, and after-school programs. This program is supported and overseen under the leadership of Redwood City 2020. The Redwood City Family Centers reach students and their families at four "family centers" housed at the elementary and middle schools (mentioned above) in a way that few programs are able to do because they are strategically linked to the school communities they serve. In July 2002, The City of Redwood City received a Program Excellence Award from the International City Managers Association for this highly successful program.

Redwood City, San Mateo County and the Redwood City School District are funding the core operations of the Redwood City Family Centers with \$104,030 from San Mateo County, \$90,000 from the Redwood City School District and \$85,500 from Redwood City for fiscal year 2005/2006. The total budget for the Redwood City Family Centers for 2005/2006 is approximately \$3.5 million. Over 50% of the budget includes redirected and in-kind resources. Additional funds include \$50,000 from the Grove Foundation, \$40,000 from the Peninsula Community Foundation, \$25,000 from the County of San Mateo- Health Department, \$100,000 through a one-time grant with the County of San Mateo- Human Services Agency, \$50,000 from the Lucile Packard Foundation for Children's Health, \$134,000 from the Cowell Foundation, \$282,200 in local funds from First 5 San Mateo County, \$40,000 from the local Children's Health Initiative, \$50,000 from the Zellerbach Family Fund. Additional contributors include; California Endowment, 21st Century, Community Learning Centers, and the John W. Gardner Center.

The agreement between the County, the School District and the City is a challenge grant. In theory, should any of the partners not contribute what has been agreed to, the others would withdraw their contributions as well. The attached amendment ensures continued sustainability for the Redwood City Family Centers for fiscal year 2005/2006.



**SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT
BETWEEN THE COUNTY OF SAN MATEO AND
THE CITY OF REDWOOD CITY,
REDWOOD CITY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT**

SECOND AMENDMENT TO THE AGREEMENT, entered into this ____ day of _____, 20____, by and between the COUNTY OF SAN MATEO, hereinafter called "County," and the CITY OF REDWOOD CITY, a municipal corporation of the State of California, hereinafter called "City," and the REDWOOD CITY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT, hereinafter called "District"; all of which entities are referred to collectively as the "Parties" for the Redwood City Family Centers.

W I T N E S S E T H:

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code, Section 31000, County may contract with independent contractors for the furnishing of such services to or for County or any Department thereof;

WHEREAS, the parties entered into an Agreement for the Redwood City Family Centers to provide coordination and administrative support to interagency school based family resource centers at Taft, Fair Oaks, Hoover and Kennedy Schools, which provide human services, health services, educational support and community development activities to a community; and

WHEREAS the County, by Change Order Number One added 1% Cost of Doing Business Increase (COBI) for FY 2004-05 to increase its contribution to \$101,000; and

WHEREAS, the parties wish to further amend the Agreement to confirm their FY 2005-06 contributions to continue support the work of the Redwood City Family Centers for the term of July 1, 2004 through June 30, 2006.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY THE PARTIES HERETO AS FOLLOWS:

6.1H-4

1. Section 12 of the Agreement is amended to read as follows:

12. Parties Provision of Funding

A. For Fiscal Year 2005-06 each of the Parties shall contribute the following sums annually to support the work of the Redwood City Family Centers as referenced herein as Exhibit A:

County of San Mateo	\$104,030
City of Redwood City	\$ 85,500
Redwood City School District	\$ 90,000

D. For Fiscal Year 2005-06, The County agrees to transfer to District its contribution in the amount of ONE HUNDRED FOUR THOUSAND AND THIRTY DOLLARS (\$104,030), and the City agrees to transfer to District, its contributions in the amount of EIGHTY FIVE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$85,500), within sixty (60) days of the date of the execution of this Agreement as referenced herein as Exhibit B.

2. Section 16.A. 1) and 3) are amended to the Agreement to read as follows:

16. Interpretation and Enforcement

A. Any notice, request, demand or other communication required or permitted hereunder shall be deemed to be properly given when deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, or when deposited with a public telegraph company for transmittal, charges prepaid, addressed:

3. Exhibit B is amended in its entirety to read as follows:

I. PAYMENTS

In full consideration of the term pursuant to this Agreement, and subject to the provisions of funding in paragraph 12.A of this Agreement herein, payment shall be made upon receipt of District's invoice on or after July 2005 as follows:

- A. County shall pay Redwood City Elementary School District one payment of ONE HUNDRED FOUR THOUSAND AND THIRTY DOLLARS (\$104,030).
- B. City will pay Redwood City Elementary School District one payment of EIGHTY FIVE THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$85,500).
- C. THE REDWOOD CITY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL DISTRICT WILL CONTRIBUTE NINETY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$90,000) TO THE REDWOOD CITY FAMILY CENTERS.

4. All other terms and conditions of the Agreement dated July 1, 2004, including Change Order Number One, dated April 28, 2005, between the parties hereto shall remain in full force and effect.
