Recommendation


1. Adopt a resolution declaring Canvass of Returns and Results of Special and General Municipal Election held on November 8, 2005.
2. Direct the City Clerk to submit the amended ratified sections of the City Charter to the Secretary of State and file a copy with the County Recorder, pursuant to Government Code 34459, 34460 and Elections Code Section 9269.

Background


The San Mateo County Elections Office was requested to conduct the Special and General Municipal Election. In the past, the Elections Office has completed the Certificate of the Chief Elections Officer after presenting the Canvass of Returns to the Board of Supervisors. As the Elections Office has now published its Semi-Official Election Results, presentation of the official elections results to the Board of Supervisors will not occur until November 29, 2005; thus, the County Elections Office will not be able to provide this office with it's certification of it's canvass of votes by the November 28, 2005 City Council meeting. This office has been in communication with the Elections Office with respect to Redwood City's general and special election results and no information has been brought to our attention that would suggest that any significant or substantial factual or numerical deviation adversely affecting the results shown on the attached Exhibit "A" is likely to be discovered at the Board of Supervisors' meeting of November 29, 2005. Under these circumstances, it is recommended that the City Council adopt the attached resolution with the proviso that such adoption be subject to any significant or substantial factual or numerical deviation which would adversely affect the election results shown on Exhibit "A". Should in the unlikely event such deviation be discovered at the Board of Supervisors' meeting, this office would return to the City Council on or about December 5, 2005 with any modifications to the resolution.

RESOLUTION NO. _____

RESOLUTION OF THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDWOOD CITY, RECITING THE FACTS OF THE CONSOLIDATED SPECIAL AND GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION HELD ON NOVEMBER 8, 2005 DECLARING THE RESULTS AND SUCH OTHER MATTERS AS PROVIDED BY LAW

WHEREAS, a Consolidated Special and General Municipal Election was held and conducted in the City of Redwood City, California, on Tuesday, November 8, 2005, as required by law; and

WHEREAS, notice of the election was given in time, form and manner as provided by law; that voting precincts were properly established; that election officers were appointed and that in all respects the election was held and conducted and the votes were cast, received and canvassed and the returns made and declared in time, form and manner as required by the provisions of the Elections Code of the State of California for the holding of elections in general law and charter cities; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Resolution No. 14654, adopted June 27, 2005, the County Election Department has tallied the votes with respect to the election, has published the Semi-Official Election Results which have been received and are attached and made a part hereof as Exhibit "A" and will report said results to the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors on or about November 29, 2005; and

WHEREAS, on or after November 29, 2005, the County Election Department will report to the City Clerk of Redwood City that it has canvassed the returns of the election and has certified results to this City Council; and

WHEREAS, at this time there appears no reasonable basis to believe that on or after November 29, 2005, the returns of this election will deviate in any significant or substantial factual or numerical manner from the results as shown in Exhibit A.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDWOOD CITY, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. That the names of persons voted for at the general election for Member of the City Council are as follows: Diane Howard, Jim Hartnett, Jeff Ira, Adrian Brandt, and Hilary S. Paulson. That the name of the person voted for at the special election for Member of the City Council was Alicia C. Aguirre. That the measures voted upon at the election are as follows: Measure "L" – Shall

specified sections of the City Charter be amended to allow appropriations or expenditures of public money to be approved by resolution; permit the City Council to establish by motion a date for the City Manager to submit a proposed budget; and permit the City Council to adopt its budget and cancel any approved appropriation by resolution?; and Measure "M" – Shall specified sections of the City Charter be amended to permit the Library Board to furnish its proposed budget to the City Manager by the same date as required of other city departments; allow Planning Commissioners and Port Commissioners to continue to hold office until their successors are appointed and qualified; and to permit the Board of Equalization to meet on any regular City Council meeting date in July of each year?; Measure "N" – Shall a specified section of the City Charter be amended to allow a change in the various threshold amounts for the purchase of materials or supplies to determine when contracts (1) may be awarded without solicitation or advertisement; (2) may be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder after solicitation but without advertisement or public bidding; and (3) may be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder after public bidding?

SECTION 2. That the number of votes given in the City to each of the persons above named for the respective offices for which the persons were candidates and for and against the measures were as listed in the attached Exhibit "A."

SECTION 3. The City Council does declare and determine that, subject to any significant or substantial factual or numerical deviations adversely affecting the general election results shown on Exhibit A, the following candidates were elected for the full term of four years by the following vote:

SECTION 4. The City Council does declare and determine that, subject to any significant or substantial factual or numerical deviations adversely affecting the special election results shown on Exhibit A, the following candidate was elected for a two-year term by the following vote:

Alicia C. Aguirre	12,225

SECTION 5. That, subject to any significant or substantial factual or numerical deviations adversely affecting the election results shown on Exhibit A, and as a result of the election, a majority of the voters voting on the Measures relating to the Charter Amendments (Measures "L," "M," and "N") did vote in favor of them and that the measures were carried and shall be deemed adopted and ratified.

Measure "L"	Yes – 8,896	No – 6,358
Measure "M"	Yes - 11,093	No – 4,328
Measure "N"	Yes - 8,065	No - 7,208

SECTION 6. The City Clerk shall enter on the records of the City Council of the City, a statement of the results of the election, showing: (1) the whole number of ballots cast in the City; (2) the names of the persons voted for; (3) the Measures voted upon; (4) for what office each person was voted for; (5) the number of votes given at each precinct to each person, and for and against each Measure; (6) the total number of votes given to each person, and for and against each Measure.

SECTION 7. The City Council of the City of Redwood City submitted to the qualified voters of the City at the Election, Measures "L," "M," and "N."

Measure L: "Shall specified sections of the City Charter be amended to allow appropriations or expenditures of public money to be approved by resolution; permit the City Council to establish by motion a date for the City Manager to submit a proposed budget; and permit the City Council to adopt its budget and cancel any approved appropriation by resolution?"

Measure M: "Shall specified sections of the City Charter be amended to permit the Library Board to furnish its proposed budget to the City Manager by the same date as required of other city departments; allow Planning Commissioners and Port Commissioners to continue to hold office until their successors are appointed and qualified; and to permit the Board of Equalization to meet on any regular City Council meeting date in July of each year?"

Measure N: "Shall a specified section of the City Charter be amended to allow a change in the various threshold amounts for the purchase of materials or supplies to determine when contracts (1) may be awarded without solicitation or advertisement; (2) may be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder after solicitation but without advertisement or public bidding; and (3) may be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder after public bidding?"

Each of the Measures passed by a majority of voters voting in favor thereof.

SECTION 8. The City Clerk shall make and deliver to each of the persons so elected a Certificate of Election signed by the City Clerk and authenticated; that the City Clerk shall also administer to each person elected the Oath of Office prescribed in the Constitution of the State of California and shall have them subscribe to it and file it in the office of the City Clerk. Each and all of the persons so elected shall then be inducted into the respective office to which they have been elected. Any or all of such actions shall be subject to any

significant or substantial factual or numerical deviations adversely affecting the election results shown on Exhibit A.

SECTION 9. The City Clerk shall submit the amended ratified sections of the City Charter to the Secretary of State and file a copy with the County Recorder, pursuant to Government Code Section 34459, 34460 and Elections Code Section 9269. Such action shall be subject to any significant or substantial factual or numerical deviations adversely affecting the election results shown on Exhibit A.

SECTION 10. That the City Clerk shall certify to the passage and adoption of this resolution and enter it into the book of original resolutions.
