Historic buildings such as the courthouse and period Historic Influence Mount Carmel neighborhoods illustrate the craftsmanship and styles of different eras. Venerable places like the Union Cemetery historic site teach us lessons. With its rich history as one of the earliest post gold rush settlements on the San Francisco Peninsula, and many still standing physical reminders of that history, Redwood City has a duty to preserve these resources for generations to come.</p>

68	Glossary	Page 15	Add definition for "Historic Influence"	<p>Historic Influence: Descriptive term associated with residential neighborhood typologies in this General Plan which are generally characterized by traditional subdivision patterns and the presence of the City's older building stock. Despite these qualities, in all cases, variety with respect to subdivision form, architectural style, and age of structure exists throughout the "Historic Influence" areas.</p> <p>"Historic Influence" does not imply that all or any part of these neighborhoods are Historic Districts or deemed to be eligible for future designation.</p>
