### Redwood Shores Construction Update

#### Redwood City Receives \$2.9 Million Grant

Redwood City, CA – The Redwood City Recycled Water Project has been awarded a \$2.9 million grant from the California State Water Resources Control Board that will assist in the installation of approximately 29,000 linear feet of recycled water distribution pipeline along the east side of Highway 101 on the Greater Bayfront and Seaport areas. This grant is approximately 25% of the selected area's project construction cost, and reduces the actual project cost to the City. The City acknowledges support from the Seaport Industrial Association and its executive director Greg Greenway, and the Commissioners and staff of the Port of Redwood City, for their tireless work that was critical in gaining this grant for Redwood City.

#### Remaining Construction on Redwood Shores Parkway

Pipeline installation on Redwood Shores Parkway west of Shoreline Drive will be active this month. Pipeline will be installed on Redwood Shores Parkway, generally beginning at Shoreline Drive and moving west toward Airport Boulevard. The two inside westbound lanes will be closed in moving segments as construction progresses.

#### Road Resurfacing in the Shores

During August, portions of the eastern section of Marine Parkway from Island Drive east to Shell Parkway will get an overlay of new asphalt to strengthen damaged pavement. In Fall of this year, other roads where recycled water pipeline was installed will be prepped and receive a slurry seal (followed by road restriping).

The streets scheduled for slurry seal are:  
Redwood Shores Parkway (from Shoreline Drive to Embarcadero);  
Marine Parkway (from Oracle Parkway/ Shoreway Road to Shearwater Parkway);  
Oracle Parkway;  
Bridge Parkway;  
Shell Parkway;  
Radio Road;  
Davit Lane (from Marlin Drive to Lakeshore Drive);  
Shoreline Drive (from Redwood Shores Parkway to Twin Dolphin Drive);  
Twin Dolphin Drive (from Redwood Shores Parkway to Marine Parkway).



Pipeline installation on Redwood Shores Parkway will begin in August near Shoreline Drive, heading west toward Airport Boulevard.

As part of this project, the City is pleased to provide an extensive network of bike lanes on most of these streets, offering Shores residents a more comfortable bicycle riding opportunity, as well as a "green" commute alternative (the exceptions are Twin Dolphin Drive, Shoreline Drive, and most of Davit Lane which are not wide enough to accommodate a standard bike lane). Instead of delineated bike lanes, Twin Dolphin and Shoreline will include a new four-foot shoulder, and Davit Lane will be marked with "sharrows" — a bike symbol with small arrows placed on the roadway about every 250 feet, to indicate where bikes should ride when cars are parked on the street.

Both phases of work require traffic detours and "no parking" restrictions on the days of the scheduled work. Normally, during the main part of the work streets will be reopened to traffic by 5:00 PM. However, streets may be closed later if necessary to allow the new surfacing to fully cure. Slurry seal activity is expected to begin this Fall. Following the completion of resurfacing, new lane lines will be marked.

#### Upcoming Construction in Seaport Area

Recycled water pipeline installation will begin in the Seaport area this summer. Purple pipe will be installed along Seaport Blvd and sections of Chesapeake Drive, Seaport Court, Beeger Road, and Herkner Road. We will notify the area at least two weeks prior to this effort getting underway.
