Open House for Area Residents and Businesses

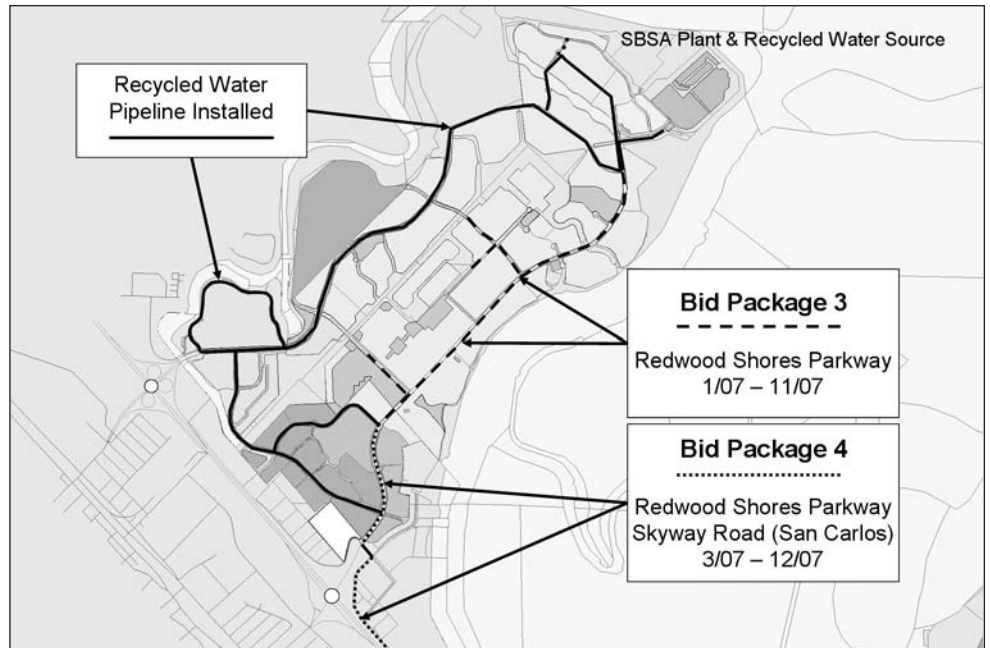

Saving Water with Synthetic Turf

As recommended by the Redwood City Recycled Water Task Force and as part of Redwood City's ongoing water conservation efforts, over seven acres of grass is being replaced by synthetic turf at several fields in Red Morton Park. Synthetic turf has already been installed at Griffin/Bechet Field, and the grass at McGarvey and Mitchell Fields will be replaced, beginning in January, with completion estimated for late spring 2007. The City has already successfully utilized synthetic turf at Hoover Community Park Sports Field and on the playing field at Fair Oaks Elementary School. Synthetic turf saves money because it requires very little maintenance (no water, no fertilizer, no mowing or other landscaping), but most importantly, Redwood City is saving and conserving water, ensuring an adequate potable water supply for our community's future.



Bid Packages 3 and 4 will complete pipeline installation along sections of Redwood Shores Parkway, Skyway Road, Shell Parkway, Davit Lane, and Bridge Parkway. Bid Package 3 was awarded to KJ Woods, the same contractor who installed pipe along Twin Dolphin and Marine Parkway.

2007 Recycled Water Pipeline Construction

Finishing Radio Road and Marine Parkway Work

Because December weather did not permit finishing all testing and final pavement work on Radio Road and Marine Parkway, this activity will continue into January. Adequate signage and traffic control will be in place when necessary. All other Bid Package 1 and 2 construction and paving work has been completed!

Construction Begins on Redwood Shores Parkway

January will see the beginning of construction on Bid Package 3. Preconstruction work, including surveying and potholing, will likely begin the week of the 8th. By the end of the month, construction will begin on Redwood Shores Parkway along the sections east of Shoreline Drive and west of Marlin Drive. Bridge Parkway will also be having pipeline installed during this first phase of construction.

This Year's Pipeline Construction Activity

In 2007, the City of Redwood City will be continuing work on its recycled

water pipeline system along Redwood Shores Parkway and Skyway Road in the Redwood Shores area. The construction will include trenching in the streets and the installation of pipeline segments on Redwood Shores Parkway between Shearwater Parkway and Airport Way, with some sections of Shell Parkway, Davit Lane, and Bridge Parkway, then continuing along Skyway Road past the airport (San Carlos permit pending).

Your patience and understanding during construction has been much appreciated, and we will continue to do our best to minimize project-related disruptions during construction.
