Seaport Area Pipeline Construction Update

Seaport Court, Herkner Road and Seaport Blvd northeast of Chesapeake Drive

Installation of the Bid Package No. 5 section of the Recycled Water Project pipeline is complete. Road resurfacing activity over previously trenched sections of the roadway will occur in March, weather permitting.

Chesapeake Drive and Seaport Center Loop

Bid Package No. 6 will be the next area of recycled water pipeline construction. The Contractor is expected to begin pipeline installation by mid March. Chesapeake Drive access will be maintained throughout the duration of the Project. Construction work hours will be from 7:30 AM – 4:30 PM, Monday through Friday.

Community Workshop

The City is considering a Recycled Water Use Ordinance to provide guidelines for the future use of recycled water, as the City continues to seek ways to preserve our community's limited drinking water supply for today, and for the generations to come. The proposed ordinance will focus on how recycled water might best fit into the plans for new development projects, and will outline which areas of the City may be most feasible for providing the recycled water infrastructure.

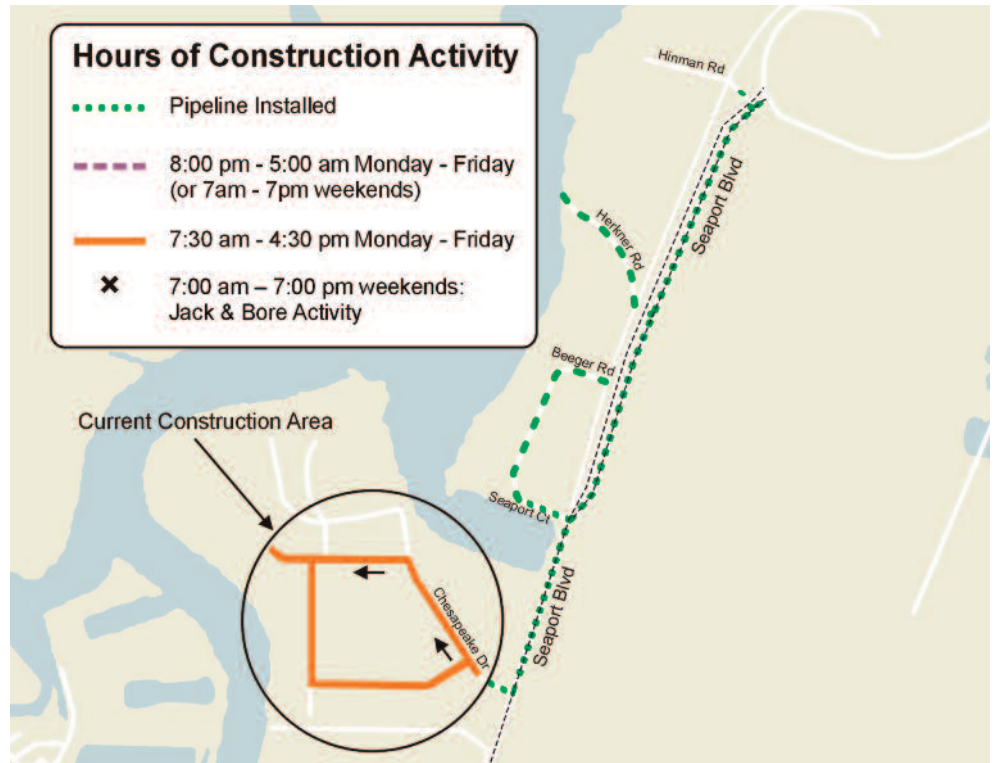
