Redwood Shores Construction Update

Redwood Shores Parkway

Pipeline installation is active along Redwood Shores Parkway. Starting near Shoreline Drive on Redwood Shores Parkway and moving west (toward the freeway), the two innermost westbound lanes will be closed in moving segments as pipeline is installed. Two-way traffic and driveway access will be maintained. Flagmen and signage will be present as necessary.

Road Surfaces Will Be Further Improved

City staff and project team members have been reviewing streets affected by the recycled water pipeline construction, and have noticed areas that may need to have additional improvements before a slurry seal can be added. Some of this work involves trench restoration and in some cases repaving. We have also received a number of calls and emails from people calling our attention to these same road surface areas.

Therefore, the project team believes it would be prudent and beneficial to postpone slurry sealing roadwork, originally slated for this fall, until early next year — as soon as weather and temperatures allow us to proceed with this process. This will give our construction and repair crews a little more time to do the best job possible in restoring these impacted road surfaces. Road repairs are already underway. Pipeline work along Redwood Shores Parkway is to be completed by November. This should make for an improved road surface for the winter with no further construction delays, and only the final aesthetic finish remaining next year, which should take about three weeks.

We appreciate the public feedback regarding road surface conditions. Please be assured Redwood City is also committed

to restoring its streets and roadways to a level that reflects the high standards of this community. Thank you again for your patience and cooperation.

Continuing Innovative Conservation Efforts

As a continued commitment to the recommendations made by the Recycled Water Task Force, recycled water will not be used to irrigate parks, schools, or areas where children play, including the new Redwood Shores Library, the Electronic Arts Day Care Center, and the Children's Creative Learning Center (CCLC). Instead, the City is looking at additional conservation measures, including using artificial turf, which is already being used at Fair Oaks Elementary School, Hoover Community Park Sports Field, and at Griffin/Bechet, McGarvey and Mitchell Fields, and soon to be installed at Sandpiper Elementary School and Marlin Park. By installing synthetic turf, potable water that would have previously been used for irrigation is being saved for drinking and other critical indoor uses.
