

COPY**ORIGINAL****RESOLUTION NO. 14547****RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF REDWOOD CITY APPROVING THE REDWOOD CITY RECYCLED WATER PROJECT AND ASSOCIATED FACILITIES**

THIS RESOLUTION is approved in light of the following facts and circumstances which the City Council finds to exist:

1. On August 6, 2002, the Planning Commission certified a Mitigated Negative Declaration for the Redwood City Recycled Water Project ("Project"). The Project consists of infrastructure facilities (transmission and distribution pipelines, pump stations, storage reservoirs and minor appurtenant facilities) to deliver disinfected tertiary recycled water from the South Bayside System Authority (SBSA) wastewater treatment plant to customers in the Redwood Shores, Greater Bayfront and Central Redwood City areas, for non-potable uses such as landscape irrigation.

2. On July 28, 2003, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 14544, approving and confirming the Mitigated Negative Declaration, and adopting the mitigation monitoring program approved by the Planning Commission.

3. On July 28, 2003, the City Council adopted Resolution No. 14545, finding that the use of recycled water for landscape irrigation is safe, is environmentally responsible, and can contribute to the health, safety and welfare of all Redwood City residents.

4. The City Manager has recommended that the City Council move forward by formally approving a recycled water project and that the Council direct staff to take such steps as may be reasonably necessary to implement the delivery of recycled water

for non-potable uses in a way that is both cost-effective and respectful of the concerns expressed by City residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF REDWOOD CITY, AS FOLLOWS:

The Redwood City Recycled Water Project is approved, subject to the mitigation measures adopted by the Planning Commission

1. No above-ground storage tanks or pump stations are to be constructed without prior review of detailed plans by the Planning Commission.

2. Staff is directed to take such steps as may be reasonably necessary to implement the Redwood City Recycled Water Project.

3. The City Clerk is directed to file a Notice of Determination with the San Mateo County Clerk and the State of California Office of Planning and Research. The City Council finds, on the basis of the Initial Study, that the project involves no potential for adverse effect, either individually or cumulatively, on wildlife, makes the findings specified in 14 CCR section 753.5(c), and directs that a Certificate of Fee Exemption also be filed.


