




# CITY OF REDWOOD CITY NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

## PLANNING COMMISSION HEARING

Tuesday, November 7<sup>th</sup> at 7 p.m.

Council Chambers, City Hall, 1017 Middlefield Road, Redwood City



**Consideration of the Draft El Camino Real Corridor Plan**, a policy document that includes visions, goals, strategies, and implementation actions for street improvements to make the Corridor more pleasant to walk along and safer to cross, and policies that support small businesses and a range of housing choices along the Corridor. The plan is a guiding document that requires further actions by the City or other agencies to execute the plan, as described the plan's implementation section. The Plan is organized into four topics, briefly described below.

1. **Mobility** addresses the various ways people travel around the Corridor
2. **Economic Vitality** addresses ways to support existing Corridor businesses
3. **Housing** addresses ways to provide housing for a range of income levels, support existing neighborhoods, and improve services for residents
4. **Place-Making** addresses ways to improve the Corridor's aesthetics and identity

**CEQA:** Statutory Exemption (15262); Feasibility and Planning Studies. The Corridor Plan is a Planning Study which provides recommendations to implement the Plan.

**How to provide comments:** Comments on the project must be given in person at the public hearing or in writing by the time of the hearing.

**Who receives a notice:** Ten days prior to the hearing date, notice of this hearing is posted on the City's website, published in the newspaper, and sent to all owners or residents of property located within 300 feet of the project site, including any interested person who requested a notice.

**What can be challenged:** If you challenge the action in court, you may be limited to raising only those issues you or someone else raised at the public hearing described in this notice, or in written correspondence delivered to the hearing body at, or prior to, the public hearing.
