

DOCKTOWN UPDATE

City officials continue to focus on supporting Docketown tenants as the City works to comply with State law by ending residential uses at Docketown Marina.

Over the last two years, the City has provided extensive notification to Docketown tenants and to the public that residential uses at the Docketown Marina would end. The relocation process was intended to provide community members with a reasonable extended timeframe to transition to other housing options.

Over the last year and a half, about 50 Docketown tenants and sub-tenants have accepted relocation assistance and moved to new housing. At this time about 20 tenants and sub-tenants remain at Docketown. In June 2018 the City notified remaining tenants that their tenancy ends August 31. Tenants remaining after this date will be subject to legal proceedings.

On a parallel but related track, the Port has initiated plans and engineering for repairs and upgrades to the "C" dock restroom and laundry facilities of the Municipal Marina in order to accommodate up to 18 liveaboard tenants. The City is helping to fund these improvements. At this time, three liveaboard tenants have relocated from the Docketown Marina to the Municipal Marina.
