Monthly Investment Report for Period Ending July 31, 2013.

Background

The attached investment report indicates that on July 31, 2013 surplus funds (excluding cash with fiscal agents) from all sources in the amount of \$125,410,353.80 were invested producing an average yield of 0.513%. The target Fed Funds rate for July is 0.25%. The report represents all securities in which City funds, including all trust funds and agency funds are invested (excluding deferred compensation plans) and all of these investments are in compliance with the City policy.

No securities purchased in the month of July.

No securities matured, were called, or sold in the month of July.

The City's investment policy requires that approximately 50% of idle funds be placed in liquid investments, not more than 50% of idle funds be invested for more than one year, and not more than 25% of idle funds be invested for more than two years. Based on the City's current investments:

As of July 31, the City has sufficient liquid resources available to meet expenditure requirements for the next six months.

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* Difference in value between Principal Amount and Market Value may be due to timing of purchase. Some of these investments may have been purchased when interest rates were low. Principal amount also indicates PAR (face) value and does not reflect whether investment was purchased at a discount or premium. As interest rates increase or decrease the value of the investment will decrease or increase accordingly. The City's investment intention is to hold the investments to maturity thereby receiving PAR value at maturity unless the City will realize a profit by liquidating the investment prior to maturity date.

The following summarizes the City's investment policy liquidity and maturity requirements based on current surplus funds

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and the City's actual current standing:

- Policy:
- 1 Approximately 50% of idle funds will be placed in investments that can be sold at face value in event of emergency (liquid investments plus securities with market value at least equal to par value)
 - 2 Not more than 50% of idle funds shall be invested for more than one year (based on market value, maturity greater than one year)
 - 3 Not more than 25% of idle funds shall be invested for more than two years (based on market value, maturity greater than two years)
