
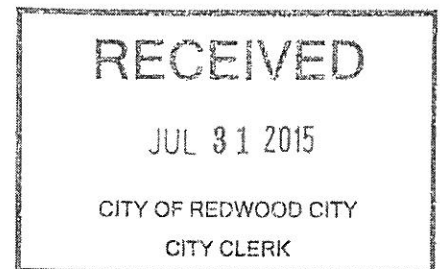
I will work to ensure fiscal stability and responsible financial management policies at City Hall, including increasing reserve funds. And I will support policies that maintain a strong local economy.

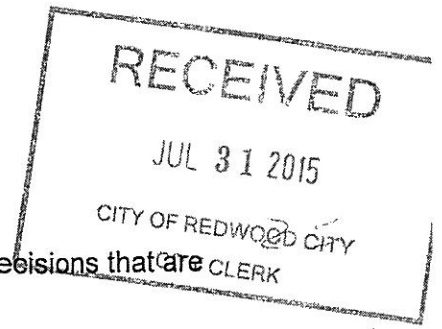

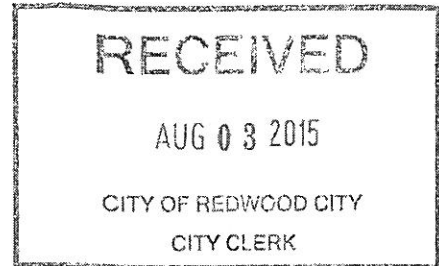

As the daughter of an insurance clerk and maintenance worker, I was raised to work hard, finish the job, and stay true to my values.

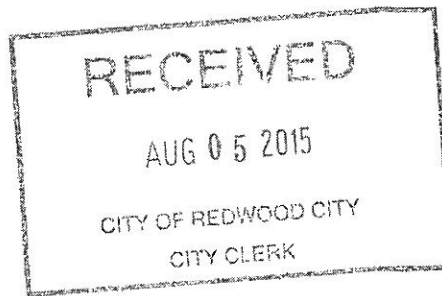

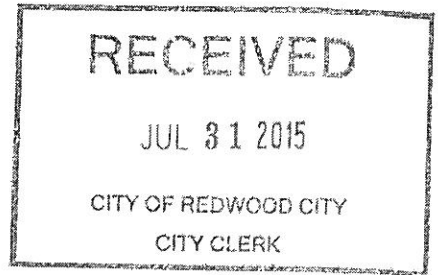

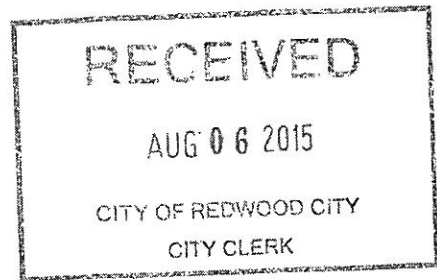
I will support our children, youth, and families. Working together, we can continue to make Redwood City a great place for kids and families. This means partnering with our schools and community organizations, and protecting library services.
